About the festival

The Limerick Bastille Day Wild Geese Festival is a community-led non-profit annual event which commemorates the Flight of the Wild Geese and celebrates the longstanding friendship between Ireland and France. It is organised every year on the weekend closest to Bastille Day (July 14th), the French National Day. It was founded in 2019 by the Honorary Consul of France in Limerick with the support of the Limerick City & County Council and is now organised by Alliance Française Limerick, one of the city's longest running non-profit organisation providing French language classes and holding cultural events since 1944. The festival promotes intercultural understanding, education on local and international history, and artistic creation. It is sponsored or supported by a wide range of businesses and organisations. The Flight of the Wild Geese saw over 12,000 Irish soldiers and their families leave Ireland for France following the signing of the Treaty of Limerick in 1691. Many of these soldiers, who became known as the Wild Geese, ended up joining the French army and settling in France, thus creating long-lasting bounds between Ireland and France. For example, many of the Bordeaux region world-renowned vineyards were created by descendants of the Wild Geese (Château Kirwan, Château McCarthy, Château Lynch-Bages, etc.). One of France's presidents, Patrice de McMahon (1808-1893), was a descendant of the McMahons of Limerick and General Charles de Gaulle was himself related to the McCartans of County Down. These are just a few examples of the many links between Ireland and France (now Ireland's closest EU neighbour) which we celebrate during our annual festival and which you can explore by visiting the Wild Geese Museum, in the old Saint Munchin's Church of Ireland on King's Island (a museum jointly created by the Honorary Consulate of France in Limerick, the Limerick Civic Trust and the Limerick Museum). This year, for instance, we commemorate the 225th anniversary of the rebellion of the year 1798 (aka "The Year of the French") which saw General Humbert land in County Mayo and, along with the United Irishmen, proclaim the Republic of Connaught. On behalf of Alliance Française Limerick, we wish you all a wonderful weekend of fun and culture!



From the Wild Geese Museum to Saint Mary's Cathedral (free for all)

Join a joyful and colourful procession, led by the musicians of the Saint Mary's Men's Shed and featuring the reenactors from En Garde – The Society for Franco-Irish History, departing from the Wild Geese Museum and going to the United Nations Peace Garden in front of Saint Mary's Cathedral, via Nicholas Street, just on time for the ceremony which will be held there.







2.30pm

United Nations Peace Garden, in front of Saint Mary's Cathedral (free for all)

Like in previous years, a ceremony supported by the Defence Forces will be held to commemorate the Flight of the Wild Geese and the long-standing friendship between Ireland and France. It will begin by a parade of veteran associations including: the French Foreign Legion Association of Ireland, the Limerick branches of the O.N.E., the Irish Naval Association, the Royal British Legion of Ireland and the I.U.N.V.A. Reenactors from En Garde -The Society for Franco-Irish History will close the march dressed as soldiers from Napoléon's Légion irlandaise and will later on conclude the ceremony with a reading of General Humbert's 1798 proclamation. For the first time this year, the parade march and the national anthems will be performed by Band 1 of the Defence Forces.







Sunday 16 July

3.00pm

Saint Mary's Cathedral (free but pre-booking compulsory due to limited capacity)

Book your free ticket <u>HERE</u> for this amazing show, in the magnificent surroundings of Saint Mary's Cathedral, which will include a music and dance performance and the screening of a film!

The music and dance performance is that of Cuimhnigh ar Sarsfield: The Wild Geese Suite, a poetic-musical tribute to Patrick Sarsfield and the Wild Geese. This composition, commissioned by our festival and already performed at King John's Castle in 2021, combines music, dance, history, and language in order to illuminate a key story in the history of the Treaty City, and has been created collaboratively by composer Dr. Francis Ward and lyricists Dr. Mairéad Ní Bhriain and Dr. Orfhlaith Ní Bhriain. It includes a choreography by Limerick's Scoil Uí Ruairc dance troupe (including solo Irish dance by Zoe Griffin). Performers: Tara Breen (fiddle), Paul Harrigan (uilleann pipes), Damian McKee (button accordion), Dermot Sheedy (percussion), Arco String Quartet. Recitation by Orfhlaith Ní Bhriain.

The film which will then be screened is entitled The Flight of the Wild Geese. Inspired by a play by the late Declan Bromell entitled The Walls of Limerick (1990), it tells the story of the sieges of Limerick and of all the events that ensued. It was entirely filmed on location, written and directed by Corpus Christi Moyross Primary School teacher Fionnuala Bromell, filmed and produced by her colleague Diarmuid Hickey with the assistance of their fellow teachers Kate Walshe and Louise Clancy (production team). It stars Corpus Christi's fifth-class pupils in the roles of the Jacobites, the French and the Williamites. Be prepared, this is no ordinary school production, this film, which includes an original score and songs by the school choir and community choirs and parents and past pupils, will blow your mind! This incredible project was commissioned for the festival and was made possible thanks to the support of Alliance Française Limerick, El Electronics and Humanli.

Curraghgour Boat Club, Merchant's Quay (free for all)

Follow the music (played by bagpiper Michael Egan) and the reenactors for a farewell to the Wild Geese organised in partnership with the Curraghour Boat Club.



7.00pm

Mickey Martin's, 1 Augustinian Lane (free for all, except for the drinks!)

Come to "L'After Party", at the 200 year-old Mickey Martin's Pub, to find out what happened to the Wild Geese after they left Limerick (and also how the city evolved since their departure) with a talk by local historian Sharon Slater. Totally uncorroborated Wild Geese stories will also be shared afterwards and special Hennessy Wild Geese cocktails will exceptionally be on the drink menu!
