The Limerick Wild Geese Festival is a community-led non-profit annual event which commemorates the Flight of the Wild Geese and celebrates the long-standing friendship between Ireland and France. It is organised every year on a weekend close to Bastille Day (July 14th), the French National Day. It was founded in 2019 by the Honorary Consul of France in Limerick with the support of the Limerick City & County Council and is now organised by Alliance Française Limerick, one of the city's longest running non-profit organisation providing French language classes and holding cultural events since 1944. The festival promotes intercultural understanding, education on local and international history, and artistic creation. It is sponsored or supported by a wide range of businesses and organisations. The Flight of the Wild Geese saw over 12,000 Irish soldiers and their families leave Ireland for France following the signing of the Treaty of Limerick in 1691. Many of these soldiers, who became known as the Wild Geese, ended up joining the French army and settling in France, thus creating long-lasting bounds between Ireland and France. For example, many of the Bordeaux region world-renowned vineyards were created by descendants of the Wild Geese (Château Kirwan, Château McCarthy, Château Lynch-Bages, etc.). One of France's presidents, Patrice de McMahon (1808-1893), was a descendant of the McMahons of Limerick and General Charles de Gaulle was himself related to the McCartans of County Down. These are just a few examples of the many links between Ireland and France (now Ireland's closest EU neighbour) which we celebrate during our annual festival. On behalf of Alliance Française Limerick, we wish you all a wonderful weekend of fun and culture!

A Very Jacobite Evening in Limerick

5.30pm, LPYMA, 97 O'Connell Street (free but booking required)

Come and join us at the LPYMA hall to witness history with the handover ceremony of a very rare illuminated manuscript roll by Limerickman and Jacobite James Terry (1660-1725). The precious manuscript was purchased in London by Irish company Heavey Technology to be put on permanent display at the Limerick Museum.

The hand-over ceremony will be immediately followed by a public talk by Dr Harman Murtagh who will present the fascinating fruit of his and his late father's years of research on the Irish Jacobite armies during the Williamite War in Ireland including the sieges of Limerick (1689-1691). This event is free but pre-booking via Eventbrite is compulsory due to the limited capacity of the room.

Official Unveiling Ceremony

10.30am, Sarsfield statue, Cathedral Place (free for all)

An explanatory panel about Patrick Sarsfield will be unveiled during an official ceremony organized by the Sarsfield Statue Committee, a group of Limerick residents who take regular initiatives to maintain the monument with the support of local stakeholders. The panel project was initiated by committee members Garry Jackson (The Gathering) and Tom O'Brien. The panel was designed by Jason Cooke (Jason Cooke Creative Design) with text in English and French by committee member Dr Loïc Guyon (Honorary Consul of France and Associate Professor at Mary Immaculate College) and translation into Irish by Breandán Ó Hannaidh (Conradh na Gaeilge). In addition to the works which were commissioned by the voluntary committee over the past two years (including flower beds, with flowers kindly provided by Matt Kennedy, and the restoration of a gate, with metal work made by Derek Hannon), this year's works include the restoration of the pedestal lettering to its original colour (thanks to committee member Randel Hodkinson) and the repairing of the spotlights illuminating the statue at night (thanks to Mayor Moran and the Limerick City & County Council). Permission for the works was granted to the committee by the diocese (landowner) thanks to the intercession of committee member Canon Gerard Garrett. Guidance on the works was provided by committee member and former Conservation Officer Tom Cassidy. The Sarsfield Statue Committee wishes to thank Conservation Officer Shona O'Keeffe and Assistant Conservation Officer Nancy O'Neill for their great assistance in obtaining the administrative approval for the works.

Sunday 6 July

The Annual Wild Geese Parade and Flag Raising Ceremony

2pm, from Arthur's Quay Park to Saint Mary's Cathedral via Sarsfield Bridge and Thomond Bridge (free for all)

Witness a joyful and colourful procession, led by Band 1 of the Defence Forces and departing from Arthur's Quay park at 2pm sharp. The parade will march to Saint Mary's Cathedral via the city center and will conclude in front of the United Nations Peace Garden, with our annual flag raising ceremony (starting at 2.30pm).

The following organisations and community groups will take part in the parade: members of the 12th Infantry Battalion of the Defence Forces, O.N.E. veterans, I.U.N.V.A. veterans, Irish Naval Association, Royal British Legion of Ireland, French Foreign Legion Association of Ireland, Saint Mary's Men's Shed, Conradh na Gaeilge, Craobh Chathair Luimnigh and Fóras na Gaeilge. The parade will also feature reenactors from En Garde – The Society for Franco-Irish History dressed as soldiers from Napoléon's Légion irlandaise (a symbolic reminder of Ireland's role in France's military history).





Sunday 6 July

A Musical Journey into the Past

3pm, Saint Mary's Cathedral (free but booking required)

Join us inside Saint Mary's Cathedral for a unique performance bringing together renowned artists!

From Brian Boru to the Siege of Limerick, Ireland was culturally coherent but politically divided. Her music and poetry were Gaelic. From the mid-17th century the influences of European politics, literature, and music began to take greater prominence in Irish life. Perhaps the greatest record of this in our cultural anthology is bound up in the events and politics at which the Siege of Limerick and the flight of the Wild Geese were central.

In this concert, we present a musical journey that weaves in and out of multiple routes and explores the numerous Atlantic regions that came into contact with Irish music and poetry. With a historical and stylistic reach across more than five centuries, Lorcán Mac Mathúna, Martin Tourish, Daire Bracken, Yonit Kosovske, and Wolodymyr Smishkewych sing and play songs and instrumental music from chamber and vernacular traditions which would have been part of the unique sound-worlds that linked the times of Brian Boru with those of Patrick Sarsfield.
